Seniors and disabled citizens who rely on dogs for companionship and protection will be able to safely exercise their dogs.

- ▶ Partner with the County of San Luis Obispo and with the Five Cities to encourage responsible dog ownership.

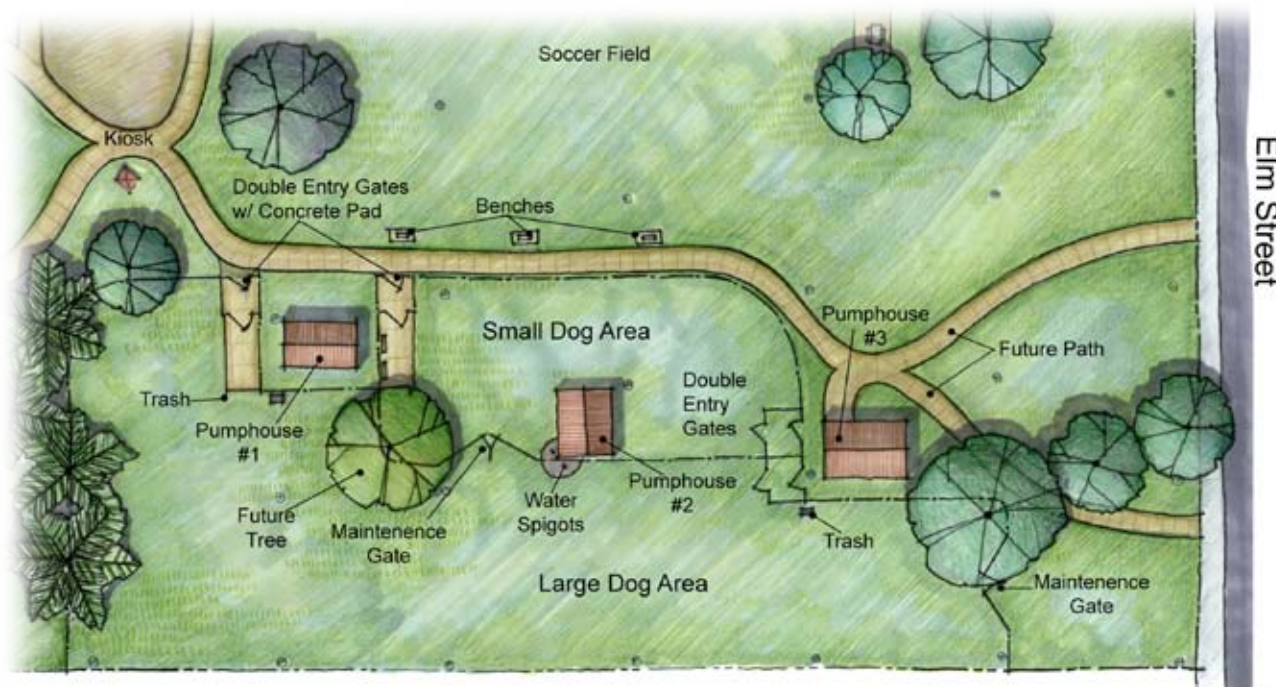
The City of Arroyo Grande has approved a 2/3rd acre site for our dog park. The park will be located at the south end of the existing Elm Street Park and have separate areas for large and small dogs.

Monies raised will be used to purchase/construct the following:

1. Fences (including concrete mow path)
2. Three entry gates
3. Sidewalks (ADA compliant)
4. Mutt Mitt dispensers
5. Trash receptacles
6. Signage
7. Benches

In addition to the items above, we will have ongoing needs (scoopers, rakes, shovels, Mutt Mitts, trash liners, etc.).

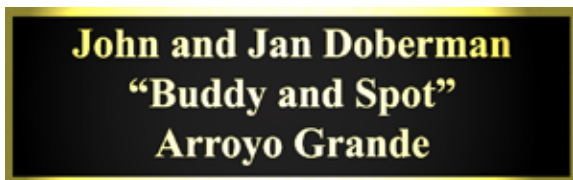
